The 10th Conference on **Database Systems for Business, Technology and the Web (BTW)** will take place from February 26 - 28, 2003, in Leipzig. The bi-annual BTW conference is the major forum of the database communities in Germany, Austria, and Switzerland, and brings together scientists and practitioners from this central European region and beyond. The BTW 2003 conference will be hosted by the University of Leipzig located in the center of the city. Leipzig is a city in East Germany of great cultural heritage: it is the city of the late work of Johann Sebastian Bach, the location of Auerbachs Keller made famous by Goethe's Faust, the place where Napoleon was defeated in the Battle of Nations in 1813, and the origin of the German reunion starting with the Monday Demonstrations in 1989.

The BTW 2003 comprises **three invited talks** of distinguished speakers

and a carefully selected **scientific program** and an **industrial program** of over 40 talks on current research and application topics.

Prior to the BTW conference, four tutorials, two workshops and a student program are offered. Further conference highlights include the opening ceremony in the new concert hall (Gewandhaus) and a dissertation award ceremony. A get-together reception for all participants, a guided city walking tour and the conference dinner in Auerbachs Keller complete the conference program.
